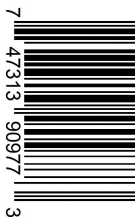

The cello was a vital part of Catalan musical expression in the first half of the 20th century. Pablo Casals as composer and cello virtuoso was its revolutionary force, and his student Gaspar Cassadó joined him in writing superb transcriptions and expressive original works with a strong sense of tradition and national melodic flavour. Casablancas' *Cant per a Frederic Mompou 'Rememrança'* pays homage to another great friend and colleague, while Enrique Granados's soulful *Madrigal* is accompanied by delectable arrangements of piano works with cello such as the *Goyescas*. A digital single featuring more pieces by Casals, Cassadó and Mompou is available on 9.70354.
